

Please note that we do not intend to be open on 8th May VE Bank Holiday. Schools are remaining open only for the children of Key Workers critical to the ongoing management of Covid-19 that are unable to safely stay at home. If there is an alternative adult, such as a partner or second parent who is not a critical worker, parents may be questioned as to why the child/ren is/are not able to stay at home as per the Government's guidance. If the other adult is working at home or able to take leave from their non-critical job, this will be deemed as a safe alternative (as per Essex LA guidance for schools). The school is currently open for those who meet the criteria in the above paragraph, BUT this will only be on the school days where we have been advised that childcare provision is required. This is so that we only open when absolutely necessary thus supporting the Government's non-essential travel guidance. Therefore a place must be 'booked' for your child to attend a school day and, for those who require it, there can be the provision of a free-of-charge after-school club ending at 4.15p.m. Please email to book your child's place under the subject title 'Critical Worker Childcare Required' giving a minimum of 24 hours' notice. Please use the admin email address (admin@st-andrewscofe.essex.sch.uk), which will be monitored on a daily basis, so that we can arrange a provision to meet your needs.
